Every half-term I meet with our Education Welfare Officer to complete register checks and set targets for attendance. He was impressed with our overall whole school attendance – currently 97.4% but had concerns about the increasing numbers of unauthorised term-time holiday absence. He strongly advised that, in line with other local schools, we should be issuing fines for this. I will be raising the issue with our Governors at the next FGB on 11<sup>th</sup> December and will keep you informed of any decisions made.

He has also instructed the school to obtain medical evidence for any child who is off sick and whose overall attendance is **less than 90%**. Medical evidence can be an appointment card from the GP, sight of prescribed medicine or a doctor's certificate. Where medical evidence cannot be provided the absence *must* be recorded by the school as unauthorised.

We know that children get sick, especially at this time of year and we do not want any child in school who is not well enough to be here. I know that the vast majority of parents exercise common sense and sound judgement in these matters but please be aware that the school has a statutory duty to follow up any child whose attendance is falling below the government recommendations.

# **Consultation on Admission Arrangements for Surrey's Community and Voluntary Controlled School for 2019**

Surrey County Council is consulting on:

- proposed changes to admission arrangements for some community and voluntary controlled schools for September 2019
- the admission arrangements for all remaining community and voluntary controlled schools for September 2019

Full details of the consultation and the changes being proposed are available at <u>Surrey</u> <u>Says</u> (www.surreysays.co.uk).

#### Why we are consulting

We have a statutory duty to consult on admission arrangements if we intend to make a change.

The changes being proposed are as follows:

- 1. **Cranmere Primary School** reduction in published admission number for Reception from 90 to 60
- 2. William Cobbett Primary School reduction in published admission number for Reception from 40 to 30
- 3. **The Dawnay School** introduction of a feeder link from Polesden Lacey Infant School at Year 3
- 4. **Reigate Priory School** introduction of a feeder link from Dovers Green and Holmesdale Community infant schools on a tiered basis

## How can I respond to the consultation?

The consultation on the admission arrangements for community and voluntary controlled schools and the proposed changes will run from Wednesday 1 November 2017 to Tuesday 12 December 2017. If you would like to take part please complete an online response form at <u>Surrey Says</u> (www.surreysays.co.uk). Alternatively if you would prefer to respond on a paper form, please telephone the Surrey Schools and Childcare Service on 0300 200 1004 to request a copy. Please note that only response forms which are fully completed with the respondent's name and address will be accepted.

#### What happens next?

After the closing date, responses will be collated and presented to the County Council's decision making Cabinet on 30 January 2018. It will decide whether or not to proceed with the proposed changes as well as determining the admission arrangements for all community and voluntary controlled schools for which no changes are proposed. Cabinet's decision will then need to be ratified by the full County Council on 6 February 2018. Once determined the final admission arrangements for all community and voluntary controlled schools will be placed on Surrey's website at www.surreycc.gov.uk/admissions.
