Eagles have been learning about ratio and proportion over the past few weeks. On Friday 20th April, we completed an investigation where we had to amend a recipe so enough smoothie could be made for the whole school. When we had done that, we worked out the amount of each ingredient that we would need to make enough for everyone. If you would like to have a go making the smoothie the ingredients, which will make enough for at least 2, are:

- 150g frozen mixed berries
- ½ apple, cored and sliced
- 100ml semi-skimmed milk
- 80g natural yoghurt
- 15g porridge oats
