

Over the course of the last year we committed to undertake some evidence based research around three areas of school development – **Outdoor Learning, Technology** and **Mastery**.

Teachers have engaged in action research in their classrooms, taken part in lesson study - working closely with colleagues to drill down into how children learn best. They have visited other local schools to observe and share best practice and have attended training both in and out of school. As a result of this we now have action plans for the three core areas.

A lot of work has already taken place including the building of the MUGA and development in the Wildlife area, the decision to purchase a set of iPads and the transformation of how we teach whole class reading.
