#### Attendance

A reminder to parents that it is our policy to inform parents if their child's attendance dips below 90%, even if we know there are valid reasons for this (e.g. sickness/agreed exceptional circumstances). Every half-term I meet with the Inclusion Team (formerly Education Welfare Team) and have to account for every child whose attendance is less than 90% and to show evidence that we are informing you and monitoring trends.

To clarify, if your child's attendance is less than 90% we have to code any future absence as "unauthorised" on our registers, *unless* we have supporting evidence e.g. GP appointment card/copy of prescription. Please note, we do not expect to see Doctor's letters as the surgery will charge you for this. If however your child is under a consultant you could show us a copy of the appointment letter, for example.
